

Your Loans

Tuition Fee • Fa Loan

- Teaching Facilities

Maintenance Loan

- Accommodation Food and bills
- Social life
- Extra curricular








Tuition Fee Loan

- Up to £9,250 per year of study
- Not means tested
- Straight to the university





Maintenance Loan

- The amount a student receives depends on three factors:
 - Where you study
 - Where you live
 - Household income
- Student bank account
- Long course loans

Additional Funding

- A wide range of sources, including additional grants from SFE
- University scholarships and bursaries
- Nursing, Midwifery and some allied health courses
- Some NHS students may get more
- It's all yours except the loan







How to Apply

Through the <u>www.gov.uk</u> student finance site

Your first year- 4 easy steps:

- 1) Register online
- 2) Fill in the application
- 3) Provide evidence
- 4) Submit

Top tip Always double check your application before you submit it.


You don't want it returned as incomplete!!





Applying - top tips

Accuracy	Don't rush, be methodical
Evidence	Provide ALL first time
Supporters	Ensure ALL providing evidence know too
Deadline	Don't forget it
Starting	Don't leave it until the last minute





Repaying your loan

- UK tax system
- Repay at 9% of your earnings over £25,000*
- Drop below £25,000 payments stop
- Finite payment period

(*from 2023)





So, what do you pay?

Remember you repay 9% of what you earn above the threshold, which is £25,000 a year, £2,083 a month or £480 a week

£30,000

or

£2,500 Per Month

 $\pounds 2,500 - \pounds 2,083 = \pounds 417$

above threshold

Your loans are written off after 40 years, regardless of how much is left to pay.




Scholarships & Bursaries

Scholarships: money usually given for something you have achieved whether this is academic or extra curricular.

Grants: a grant can be given for achievement, personal circumstance or financial need

Bursaries: these are usually given for financial need and do not need to be paid back

Scholarships & Bursaries

NHS Bursary

For UK-resident students studying at English universities, NHS funding is provided by the Learning Support Fund (LSF). Students from England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland taking an eligible pre-registration healthcare course may qualify for extra grants, including a £5,000 annual training grant.

The funding applies to undergraduate and most graduate students in these disciplines: •Dental Hygiene or Dental Therapy (level 5 or 6 courses) •Dietetics

•Midwifery

Nursing (adult, child, mental health, learning disability, joint nursing and social work)
Occupational Therapy



Scholarships & Bursaries

- •Operating Department Practitioner (level 5 or 6 courses)
- •Orthoptics
- •Orthotics and Prosthetics
- •Paramedic Science (DipHE and FD courses are not eligible for NHS LSF)
- Physiotherapy
- Podiatry or Chiropody
- •Radiography (diagnostic and therapeutic)
- •Speech and Language Therapy



Studying Abroad

Eligible students studying on a course at a UK university or college, who study outside the UK as part of their course, can apply for full student finance.

In addition, there are some special provisions if you are studying for at least the majority of a term abroad in which case you could get:

the study abroad rate of Maintenance Loan
a Travel Grant – to cover some of your travel costs.
